AWARDS

- 1986: Theater Place, a conversion of two handsome turn of the century buildings in Buffalo's theater district into a multiple use entertainment/ gallery/office/apartment complex, was selected by the American Institute of Architects, Buffalo/Western New York Chapter, as an outstanding example of adaptive reuse in Western New York.
