Hamilton Houston Lownie Architects, LLC redesigned this formally dark, cavernous library stack area into a bright and welcoming student study and computer lab space.

Using circular patterns for the floor and workstations, HHL changed the appearance of this square shaped concrete and brick space into a lively and contemporary place for students of all ages to work, study and collaborate while learning.

The predominant colors are neutral, except for the golden walls, the red power & data raceways, and the yellow, red and purple fabrics of the seating.

Two glass-walled study rooms were designed at the edge of the open work area to be private, while still being visible for security and social purposes.
