GREATER BUFFALO SAVINGS BANK PROTOTYPICAL BRANCH BANK

Western New York: Amherst, Buffalo, Kenmore, Tonawanda, Depew

Hamilton Houston Lownie Architects, LLC designed a prototypical branch bank for this newly established savings bank. The design of this new branch bank was inspired from a historic auto dealership building, which HHL redesigned to be the bank's central offices and main branch.

HHL utilizes this model plan to fit the building on various sites. Using basically the same branch footprint, we test-fit the building on maps to help GBSB determine appropriate locations for this neighborhood bank.

This new prototype is brick with metal panels, and has a corner 'tower' entry vestibule, with six (6) teller stations, three (3) platform

stations, and three (3) drive-up teller lines. HHL also designs the site and landscape to suit the context of each branch location.
